

Resilience sub Group Notes for CC Meeting 4.3.2026

1. Information on the impact of leaky dams in the local area

- i. Fife Council Flooding, Shoreline & Harbours Team information– video demonstrating leaky dams in situ .([warwickshirewildlifetrust.org.uk/working-farmers-and-landowners/natural flood management](http://warwickshirewildlifetrust.org.uk/working-farmers-and-landowners/natural-flood-management))
- ii. Scottish Flood Forum – Auchermuchty and Strathmiglo Resilience Groups hope to introduce leaky dams in Spring 2026.
- iii. Fife Coast and Countryside Trust – RESP are involved in introducing leaky dams on the Moor Road between Ceres and Cupar in support of a Cupar Castlehill flood resilience project.
- iv. RESP offering an opportunity for local landowners to visit the Moor Rd site to discuss along with representatives of RESP and Tay River Trust in March/April.

2. i) Infill hedge planting along the Brunton to Luthrie road (approx 250 yds) completed.

3. Review of current measures in response to recent rainfall

i.) The council to be informed that the camber of the road around Luthrie bank/Old school corner drain sees very little water running into it.

ii.) Gritting the road in freezing weather – Luthrie has 2 Council primary gritting roads.

3. Culvert Survey

Fife Council Flooding, Shoreline & Harbours Team updated about the the group's lack of success in getting the completing the survey.

The council will fund a drone survey. To take place once the water level is appropriate.
